Effective November 5, 1996

(Amended up to and including By-law No. 8824, dated April 6, 2004)

2 Uses

The area shown included within the heavy black outline on Schedule “A” shall be more particularly described as CD-1(359), and the only uses permitted within the outlined area, subject to such conditions as Council may by resolution prescribe, and the only uses for which development permits will be issued are

- (a) Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing on Site A only (as shown on the diagram below), [8824; 04 04 06]
- (b) Church,
- (c) Community Centre, and
- (d) Accessory Uses customarily ancillary to the above uses.

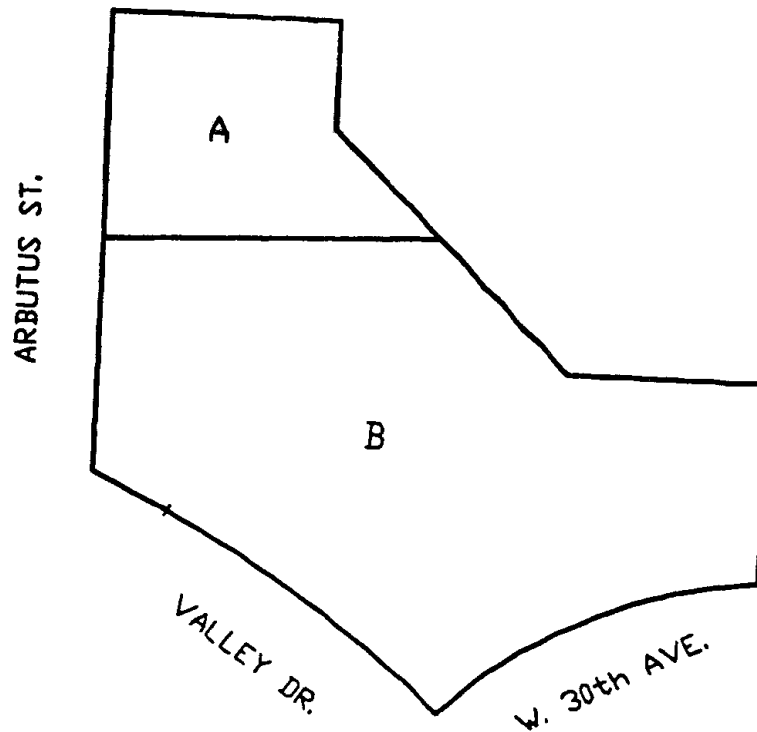
3 Floor Space Ratio

3.1 The floor space ratio must not exceed:

- (a) 0.95 on Site A, as shown on the diagram below; and
- (b) 0.67 on Site B, as shown on the diagram below.

For the purpose of computing floor space ratio, the site size for Site A shall be deemed to be 1 514 m² and for Site B shall be 5 454 m², being the parcel sizes at the time of the application for rezoning, prior to any dedications.

Note: Information included in square brackets [] identifies the by-law numbers and dates for the amendments to By-law No. 7651 or provides an explanatory note.

3.2 The following will be included in the computation of floor space ratio:

- (a) all floors having a minimum ceiling height of 1.2 m, including earthen floor, both above and below ground level, to be measured to the extreme outer limits of the building; and
- (b) stairways, fire escapes, elevator shafts and other features which the Director of Planning considers similar, to be measured by their gross cross-sectional areas and included in the measurements for each floor at which they are located.

3.3 The following will be excluded in the computation of floor space ratio:

- (a) open residential balconies or sundecks, and any other appurtenances which, in the opinion of the Director of Planning, are similar to the foregoing;
- (b) patios and roof gardens, provided that the Director of Planning first approves the design of sunroofs and walls;
- (c) where floors are used for off-street parking and loading, bicycle storage, heating and mechanical equipment, or uses which in the opinion of the Director of Planning are similar to be foregoing, those floors or portions thereof so used, which:
 - (i) are at or below the base surface, provided that the maximum exclusion for a parking space shall not exceed 7.3 m in length; or
 - (ii) are above the base surface and where developed as off-street parking are located in an accessory building situated in the rear yard, provided that the maximum exclusion for a parking space shall not exceed 7.3 m in length;
- (d) amenity areas, including day care facilities, recreation facilities, and meeting rooms, to a maximum total of 10 percent of the total building floor area;
- (e) areas of undeveloped floors which are located
 - (i) above the highest storey or half-storey and to which there is no permanent means of access other than a hatch; or
 - (ii) adjacent to a storey or half-storey with a ceiling height of less than 1.2 m; and
- (f) all residential storage space above or below base surface, except that if the residential storage space above base surface exceeds 3.7 m² per dwelling unit, there will be no exclusion for any of the residential storage space above base surface for that unit; [8760; 03 12 09]
- (g) where exterior walls greater than 152 mm in thickness have been recommended by a Building Envelope Professional as defined in the Building By-law, the area of the walls exceeding 152 mm, but to a maximum exclusion of 152 mm thickness, except that this clause shall not apply to walls in existence prior to March 14, 2000. [8169; 00 03 14]

4 Height

The maximum building height measured above the base surface is 9.2 m for the Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing. [8824; 04 04 06]

5 Setbacks

The minimum setback of a building is 3.0 m from the north property boundary.

6 Off-Street Parking and Loading

A minimum of 84 off-street parking spaces (21 spaces for the Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing and 63 spaces for the Church and Community Centre uses) and 1 loading space must be provided, developed and maintained in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Parking By-law. Bicycle spaces must be provided in accordance with the applicable sections of the Parking By-law. [8824; 04 04 06]

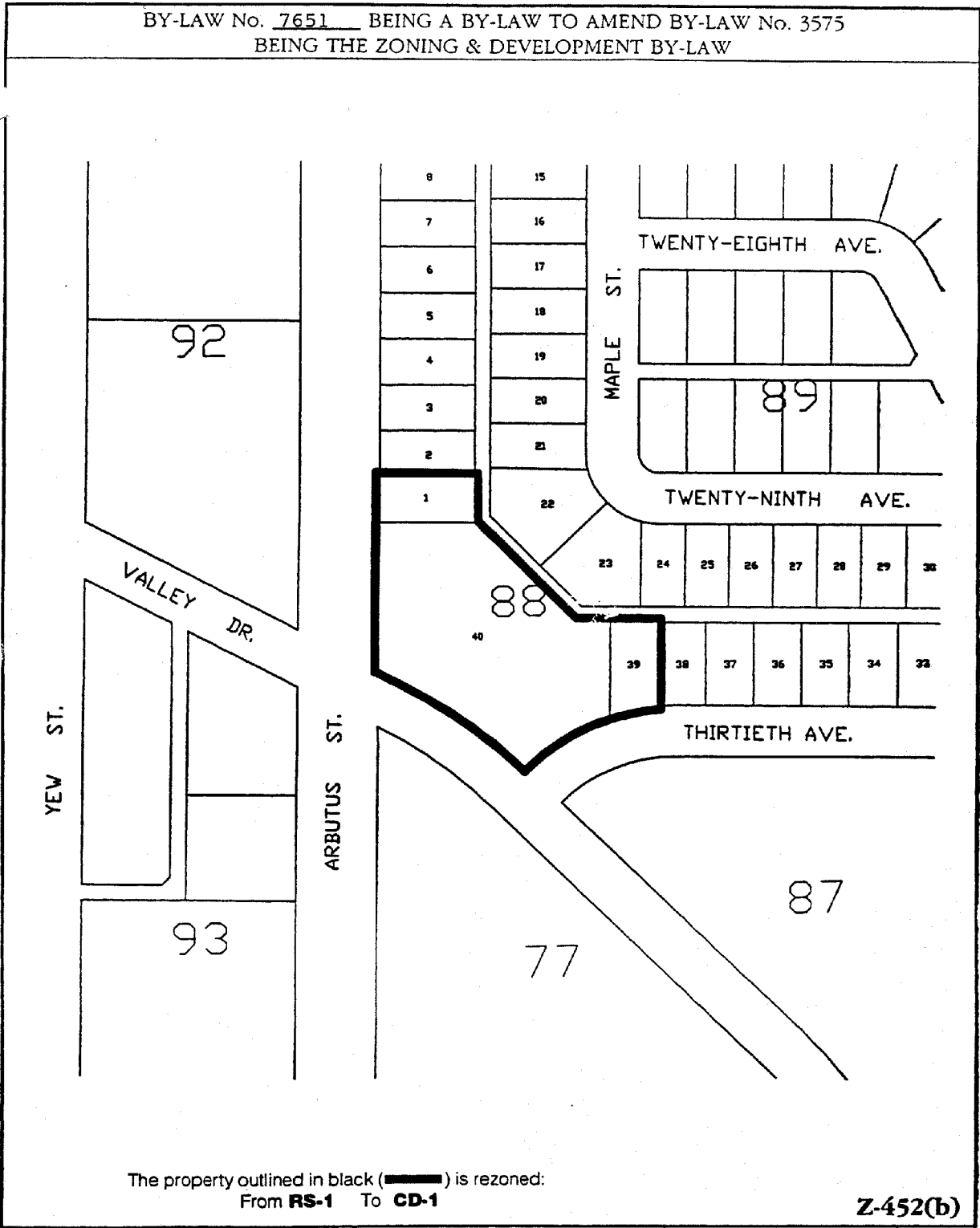
7 Acoustics

All development permit applications require evidence in the form of a report and recommendations prepared by a person trained in acoustics and current techniques of noise measurement demonstrating that the noise levels in those portions of the dwelling units listed below will not exceed the noise level set opposite such portions. For the purposes of this section the noise level is the A-weighted 24-hour equivalent (Leq) sound level and will be defined simply as noise level in decibels.

Clause No. 1 (cont'd)

Speakers

Mayor Owen called for speakers for and against the application:

Mr. Hal Kalman, on behalf of the Vancouver Heritage Commission, and Ms. Jo Scott-B, on behalf of Heritage Vancouver, advised both organizations strongly support the application as it will protect an important building on the Vancouver Heritage Register. This application proposes to use the Heritage Revitalization Agreement which is a relatively new option available to the City, and which requires no public support.

MOVED by Cllr. Kennedy,

- A. THAT Council approve a floor space relaxation, within the existing building, for the rehabilitation of this heritage "B" building at 1811 West 16th Avenue of approximately 1 387.6 m2 (approximately 14,936 sq. ft.), as proposed in DE400842.
 - B. THAT Council enter into a Heritage Revitalization Agreement (HRA) to permit the floor space relaxation, ensure the restoration of the heritage building, commemorate it with a bronze plaque, vary the Subdivision By-law to permit a non-conforming parcel configuration and permit a use variance to allow the new Church Hall on a site separate from the Church.
 - C. THAT the Director of Legal Services bring forth the by-law to authorize the Heritage Revitalization Agreement.
2. Rezoning: 4492-4500 Arbutus Street
(Seniors Housing)

An application by Hamilton Wensley Architects was considered as follows:

The proposed rezoning from RS-1 One Family District to CD-1 Comprehensive Development District, would:

- permit a 3-storey special needs residential facility - congregate housing, providing 33 sleeping units for seniors, on an expanded site, which includes St. George's Greek Orthodox Church and the Hellenic Community Centre;

cont'd....

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

- limit density for the congregate housing to a maximum floor space ratio of 0.95;
- limit height to a maximum of 9.2 m (30 ft.); and
- require a total of 84 parking spaces, of which 41 underground parking spaces replace existing surface parking that will be lost through redevelopment, provide parking for the new facility, and provide additional parking for the church and community centre.

The Director of Land Use and Development recommended approval of the application, subject to the following conditions as proposed for adoption by resolution of Council:

- (a) That the proposed form of development be approved by Council in principle, generally as prepared by Hamilton Wensley Architects, and stamped "Received City of Vancouver Planning Department, March 1, 1996", provided that the Director of Planning may allow minor alterations to this form of development when approving the detailed scheme of development as outlined in (b) below.
- (b) That prior to approval by Council of the form of development, the applicant shall obtain approval of a development application by the Director of Planning, who shall have particular regard to the following:
 - i) design development to provide details for the common outdoor amenity area adjacent to the recreation and dining spaces on the ground floor. Design development to the associated landscaping to provide a more subtle transition to the open front yard condition to the north and along Arbutus Street;
 - ii) design development to reduce the visual impact of the proposed ramp surface and opening as viewed from Arbutus Street;
 - iii) design development to clarify characteristics and functional features specifically designed for seniors' use, including aspects of adaptability, accessibility, individual storage, elevator size and proposed appliances;

cont'd....

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

- iv) design development to better integrate proposed landscaping with existing landscaping adjacent to the church as viewed from Arbutus Street;
- v) clarification of proposed materials, features and detailing that references the existing church;
- vi) design development to reduce opportunities for break and enter to ground level units; and

(Note to Applicant: This can be achieved by having units raised slightly above the pathway or street level with open landscaping. Consideration should be given to improving security to these units.)

- vii) design development to reduce opportunities for "cutting-through".

(Note to Applicant: This can be achieved by providing a gate at the north side yard.)

- (c) That prior to enactment of the CD-1 By-law, and at no cost to the City, the registered owner shall:

- i) register at the Land Titles Office a consolidation of Lot 39, Lot 40 and Lot 1 or a subdivision to create a parcel for the proposed development, to the satisfaction of the Approving Officer;
- ii) make suitable arrangements, to the satisfaction of the General Manager of Engineering Services, for the provision of a sidewalk on the east side of Arbutus Street, from approximately 18.4 m (60 ft.) north of Valley Drive, north to the main entrance to the proposed development;
- iii) make suitable arrangements, to the satisfaction of the General Manager of Engineering Services, for undergrounding of all new electrical and telephone services within and adjacent the site from the closest existing suitable service point;
- iv) provide an undertaking, to the satisfaction of the Director of Land Use and Development, that the Hellenic Community of Vancouver shall convene a meeting in each calendar year for the purpose of organizing a residents' council at the proposed development;

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

- v) execute a legal agreement satisfactory to the Director of Legal Services and the Manager of the Housing Centre, to ensure that the project is operated on a rental basis by a non-profit reporting society registered in the Province of British Columbia; and
 - vi) execute a legal agreement, to the satisfaction of the Director of Legal Services and the Manager of the Housing Centre, providing that the owner of the rental special needs residential facility shall not strata-title any of the units.
- (d) That the above agreements are to be registered in the Land Title Office and such agreements shall be registered in priority over all financial charges and all other charges which may defeat or delay enforcement of the agreement in the opinion of the Director of Legal Services.

Staff Opening Comments

Mr. Dave Thomsett, Planner, advised this application proposes to rezone the site from RS-1 to CD-1 to allow the addition of a three-storey Special Nneeds Residential Facility with congregate housing, providing 33 sleeping units for seniors, on a site which also includes St. George's Greek Orthodox Church and the Hellenic Community Centre. This housing would be privately funded, and the facility would be developed and managed by the Hellenic Community of Vancouver.

Mr. Thomsett advised of the following issues arising from the application:

- . the many concerns of the immediate neighbours around the community centre relating to traffic and parking problems, late-night noise and litter;
- . the relationship of the proposed building mass to the first house to the north, on a site replacing a one-storey bungalow.

In terms of parking, Mr. Thomsett advised there are 60 existing parking spaces on-site now, and 21 parking spaces are required for the seniors housing. The parking on-site will be reconfigured and a number will be located in the underground garage and three new spaces will be created, for a small net increase in parking. In terms of the building mass, the original application provided for a five-foot setback, and this has been increased from

9'10". As well, the second-storey roof element has been removed and the third-storey springs back to the 20-foot line. Staff believe both the building use and form are a reasonable transition between the church and the RS-1 District.

In terms of the remaining issues raised by the community regarding the problems with the community centre, Mr. Thomsett advised these issues do require attention, but should be dealt with separately from this application.

Applicant Opening Comments

Mr. Gerald Hamilton, Architect, advised the proposal to build 33 units will not result in a big building and represents a good transition between the church and the RS-1 District. The creation of this new housing has been done privately and will not require public funding.

In relation to the concerns of the immediate neighbours, Mr. Hamilton advised a public information meeting was first held prior to any plans being prepared. Following the input from this meeting, the preliminary drawings were prepared and presented at a follow-up public information meeting. Mr. Hamilton presented copies of the revised drawings (on file in the City Clerk's Office).

Mr. Hamilton referenced the concerns expressed by neighbours regarding issues arising from the operation of the Hellenic Community Centre, and suggested that neighbourliness is beginning to improve as a result of this application. The Hellenic Society and the neighbours are beginning to engage in discussions, and at the last public meeting an offer was made to form a joint committee to discuss concerns.

It was suggested that the best solution to control the noise from the community centre is to approve the 33 seniors' housing units as those residents living there will not allow noise from the community centre.

Mr. Hamilton urged Council to deal with the issues arising from the built form and to consider the remaining concerns neighbours regarding the community centre as a separate issue.

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

Summary of Correspondence

A review of the correspondence indicated eight letters opposing the application and one petition containing 52 signatures expressing parking and noise concerns.

Speakers

Mayor Owen called for speakers for and against the application, and 18 people addressed Council over the course of the evening. The following speakers were in favour of the application:

- Spice Lucks
- Angelo Pappas
- Alex Graffos
- Anastase Maragos
- representative of the Hellenic Society.

The foregoing supported the application on one or more of the following grounds:

- . elderly residents from the west side should have an opportunity to remain in the community in which they have resided, rather than being forced out to areas such as Surrey and White Rock which are long distances from their home and family;
- . many of the seniors being referred to are elderly women, who will become isolated if they are forced to leave the community and their social network;
- . the "not-in-my backyard" proponents are not addressing the needs of the seniors' community;
- . this project will not require public funding, and will be open to the entire community;
- . the Hellenic Society will provide a commitment that it will do everything it can to rectify the problems with the surrounding neighbourhood which have resulted from the operation of the community centre;
- . contrary to some statements made by other speakers, the community centre is non-profit organization, run by volunteers;

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

- . there will be 24-hour security on-site at the new facility;
- . the units will not be strata titled;
- . setbacks achieved from the adjacent RS-1 property are better than what are required under RS-1 zoning;
- . this project will have either no effect or a positive effect on the neighbours.

The following speakers opposed the application:

The foregoing opposed the application for one or more of the following reasons:

- . the Hellenic Society which operates the Hellenic Centre has been a very poor neighbour. The neighbours are forced to live with the noise, litter, parking and traffic problems associated with the busy, late-night activities of the centre;
- . the offer by the Hellenic Society to work with the neighbours has arisen because they are seeking approval for the seniors' residence. Based on their track record, this application should be refused;
- . the Hellenic Society has been operating the centre like a commercial enterprise, but it is not required to pay property taxes;
- . the new housing will not be available to the entire community, but rather members of the Greek community;

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

- . the Hellenic Society purchased this land from a neighbour who was driven out by the noise at the community centre. This rezoning will increase the value of the property. If the centre continues to make the life of the neighbours untenable, the Society may well buy and develop additional adjacent property;
- . traffic and parking around the site is a disgrace, and the underground parking will only exacerbate the situation. Those patrons attending the community centre functions will prefer to park on the street;
- . the structure is twice as high as the adjacent RS-1 property;
- . the entire surrounding neighbourhood is unified in their opposition to this application;
- . this building could be better accommodated on an existing CD-1 site elsewhere. If the Hellenic Society does wish to develop this lot, it should be done in compliance with RS-1 standards;
- . the immediate neighbour to the north on Arbutus Street, as well as the other neighbours impacted, should receive compensation from the Hellenic Society;
- . there is adequate housing for seniors in the neighbourhood. Additional seniors' housing is not required;
- . if seniors are unable to find additional housing in the neighbourhood, there are various other communities in addition to this neighbourhood where they can be accommodated;
- . existing street design is inadequate to accommodate the trucks and other vehicles entering this facility. Also, there are no plans to replace the flashing light with a permanent light. The congestion in the immediate area also presents a dangerous situation as emergency response vehicles will have slow response times;
- . at the public meeting the community has offered to meet with the Hellenic Society to discuss these problems, but there has been no response from the Society;
- . the neighbours will incur further noise and congestion during the construction of this building.

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

In response to issues, members of Council asked representatives from the Hellenic Society if the seniors' facility would be open to all members of the community, and were assured this would be case.

Applicant Closing Comments

Mr. Gerald Hamilton advised that as a result of this application, communication between the Greek community and the neighbours will continue and this is a victory for both parties involved. The applicant does not approve of compensation for the neighbours as proposed by one of the earlier delegations. Instead, the applicant guarantees that additional dialogue will take place prior to the issuance of a development permit for this application.

Staff Closing Comments

Mr. Dave Thomsett advised this is not an application for a community care or licensed facility, but a Special Needs Residential Facility with congregate housing.

Council Discussion

When considering this application, members of Council expressed concern with the lack of communication between the neighbourhood and the Hellenic Society. Council was in agreement that the provision of seniors' housing at this location was supportable, but acknowledged the differences between the Society and the neighbours needs to be addressed. As delegations from both the applicant and the neighbours indicated their willingness to meet as representatives to discuss issues related to the community centre, Council agreed that the process of consultation should be in place as a condition of development permit issuance.

It was also agreed that staff from the Integrated Services Team should facilitate a process of dialogue between the two parties, and be satisfied this process is in place within a six-month period.

MOVED by Cllr. Price,

THAT the application be approved, subject to the conditions as set out in this minute of the Public Hearing.

Clause No. 2 (cont'd)

MOVED by Cllr. Puil in amendment,

THAT, as a condition of development permit issuance, the Integrated Services Team and the Director of Planning be satisfied within a six-month period that a process of dialogue between representatives of the Hellenic Society and the surrounding neighbours has been established.

- CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY

The amendment by Councillor Puil having carried, the motion by Councillor Price was put and CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

3. Text Amendment: Pawnshops and Secondhand Stores

An application by the Director of Land Use and Development was considered as follows:

The proposed amendment to the Zoning and Development By-law and Parking By-law would:

- define "pawnshops" and "secondhand stores";
- permit pawnshops and secondhand stores in zoning districts which permit retail uses; and
- permit pawnshops and secondhand stores for a period of time limited to one year.

The Director of Land Use and Development recommended approval of the application, subject to the condition that if the amendments are approved at Public Hearing, the by-laws be accompanied at the time of enactment by the "Pawnshops and Secondhand Store Guidelines", to be adopted by resolution of Council.

Staff Opening Comments

Mr. Nathan Edelson, Planner, advised a wide range of retail businesses are involved in the sale of used merchandise. The majority of these businesses operate in a legitimate and professional manner. However, a growing number of pawnshops and secondhand stores are believed to be actively involved in the resale of stolen goods. This application proposes amendments to the Zoning and Development By-law and relevant Official Development Plans to limit their concentration and to limit the time period for which development permits for these uses are issued.

A By-law to amend

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in open meeting assembled,
enacts as follows:

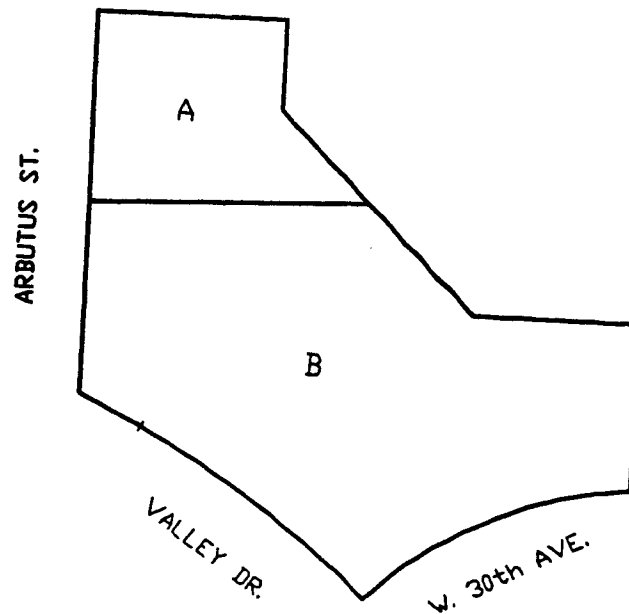

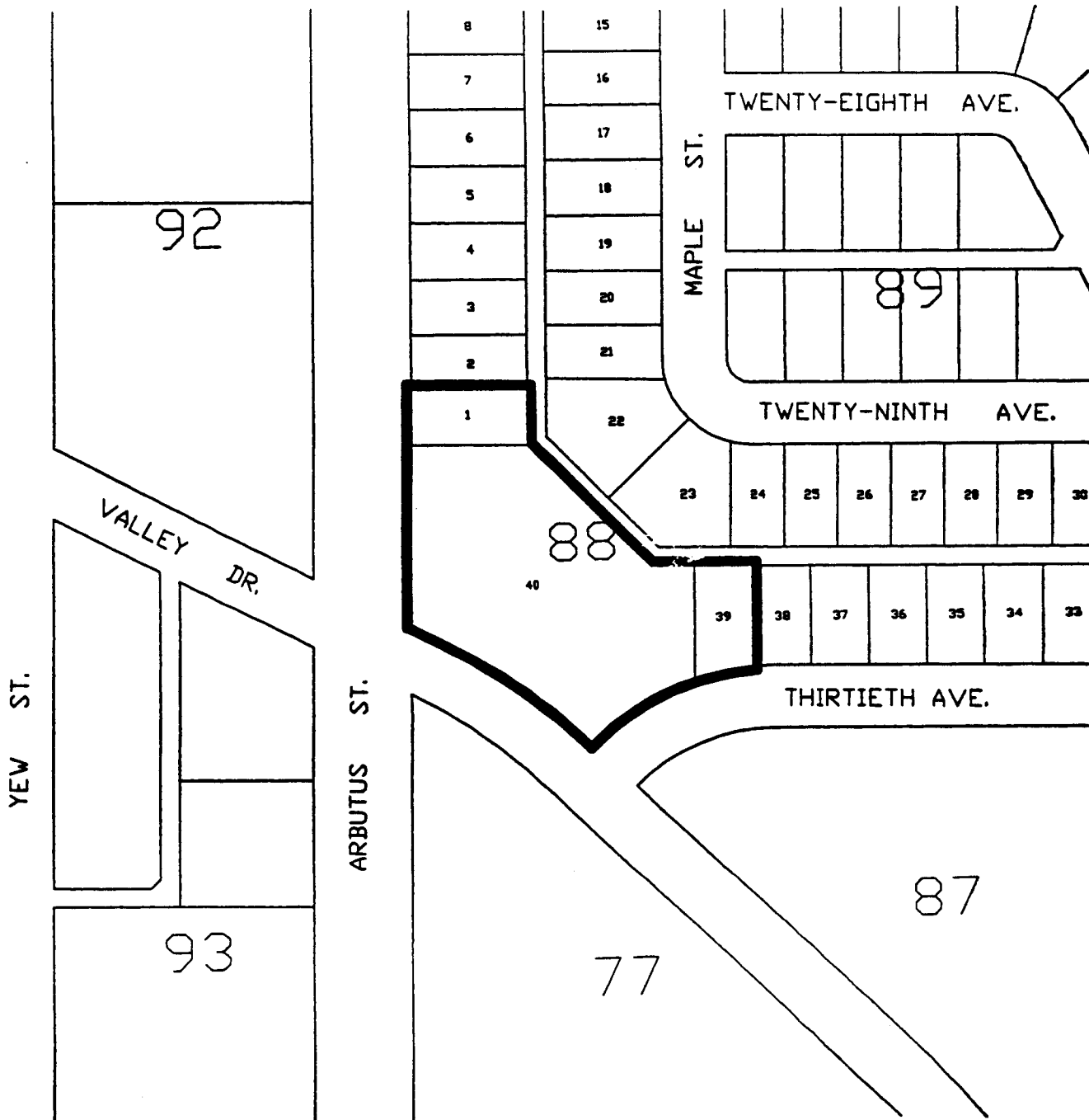

THAT the approved form of development for this portion of the CD-1 zoned site known as 4492 - 4500 Arbutus Street (4492 Arbutus Street being the application address) be generally approved as illustrated in Development Application Number DE401782, prepared by Hamilton Wensley Architects and stamped "Received, City Planning Department December 6, 1996", provided that the Director of Planning may approve design changes which would not adversely affect either the development character of this site or adjacent properties.

GENERAL MANAGER'S COMMENTS

The General Manager of Community Services RECOMMENDS approval of the foregoing.

COUNCIL POLICY

There is no applicable Council policy except that Council did approve in principle the form of development for this site when the rezoning was approved, following a Public Hearing.

PURPOSE

In accordance with Charter requirements, this report seeks Council's approval for the final form of development for this portion of the above-noted CD-1 zoned site.

SITE DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND

At a Public Hearing on May 27, 1996, City Council approved a rezoning of this site from RS-1 One-Family Dwelling District to CD-1. Council also approved in principle the form of development for these lands. CD-1 By-law No. 7651 was enacted on November 5, 1996.

The site and surrounding zoning are shown on the attached Appendix 'A'.

Subsequent to Council's approval of the CD-1 rezoning, the Director of Planning approved Development Application Number DE401782. This approval was subject to various conditions, including Council's approval of the form of development. The latter condition is one of the few outstanding prior to permit issuance.

DISCUSSION

The proposal involves the construction of a three-storey Special Needs Residential Facility - Congregate Housing for seniors, providing a total of 33 sleeping units, and located on an expanded site which includes St. Georges Greek Orthodox Church and the Hellenic Community Centre.

At the Public Hearing, Council resolved that as a condition of development permit issuance "a process of dialogue between representatives of the Hellenic Society and the surrounding neighbours be established".

At a meeting held January 27, 1997 between the Hellenic Society and representatives of the neighbourhood, a local joint committee was established to deal with neighbourhood concerns. Minutes of both, this initial meeting and a subsequent meeting held February 12, 1997, were forwarded to the Integrated Service Team for review. As a result, both the Director of Planning and the Integrated Service Team are now satisfied that the process of dialogue has been established and consider this condition to have been met.

Simplified plans, including a site plan and elevations of the proposal, are included in Appendix 'B'.

CONCLUSION

The Director of Planning has approved Development Application Number DE401782, subject to various conditions to be met prior to the issuance of the development permit. One of these conditions is that the form of development first be approved by Council.

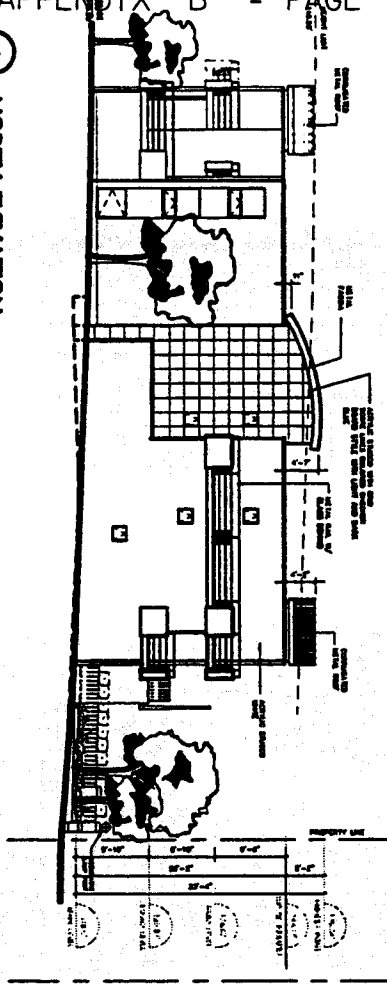

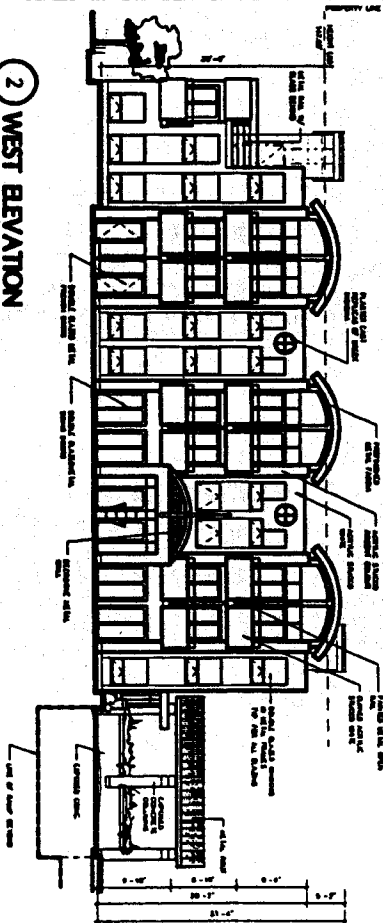

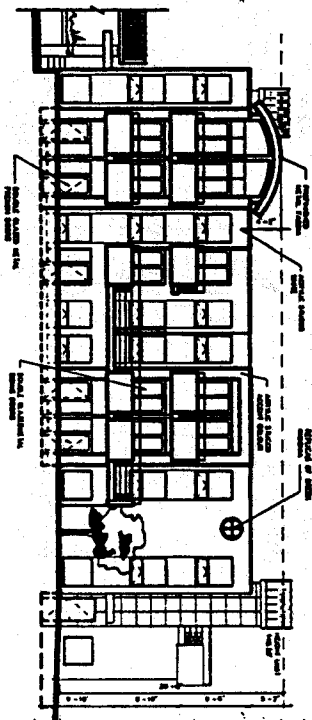
1 NORTH ELEVATION



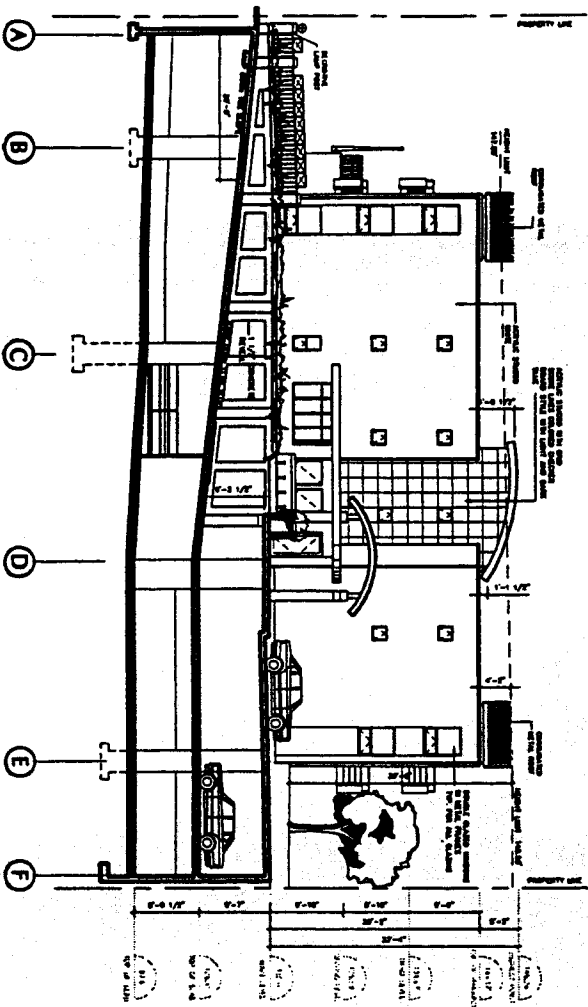
2 WEST ELEVATION



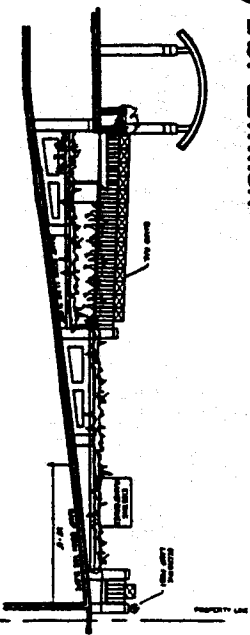

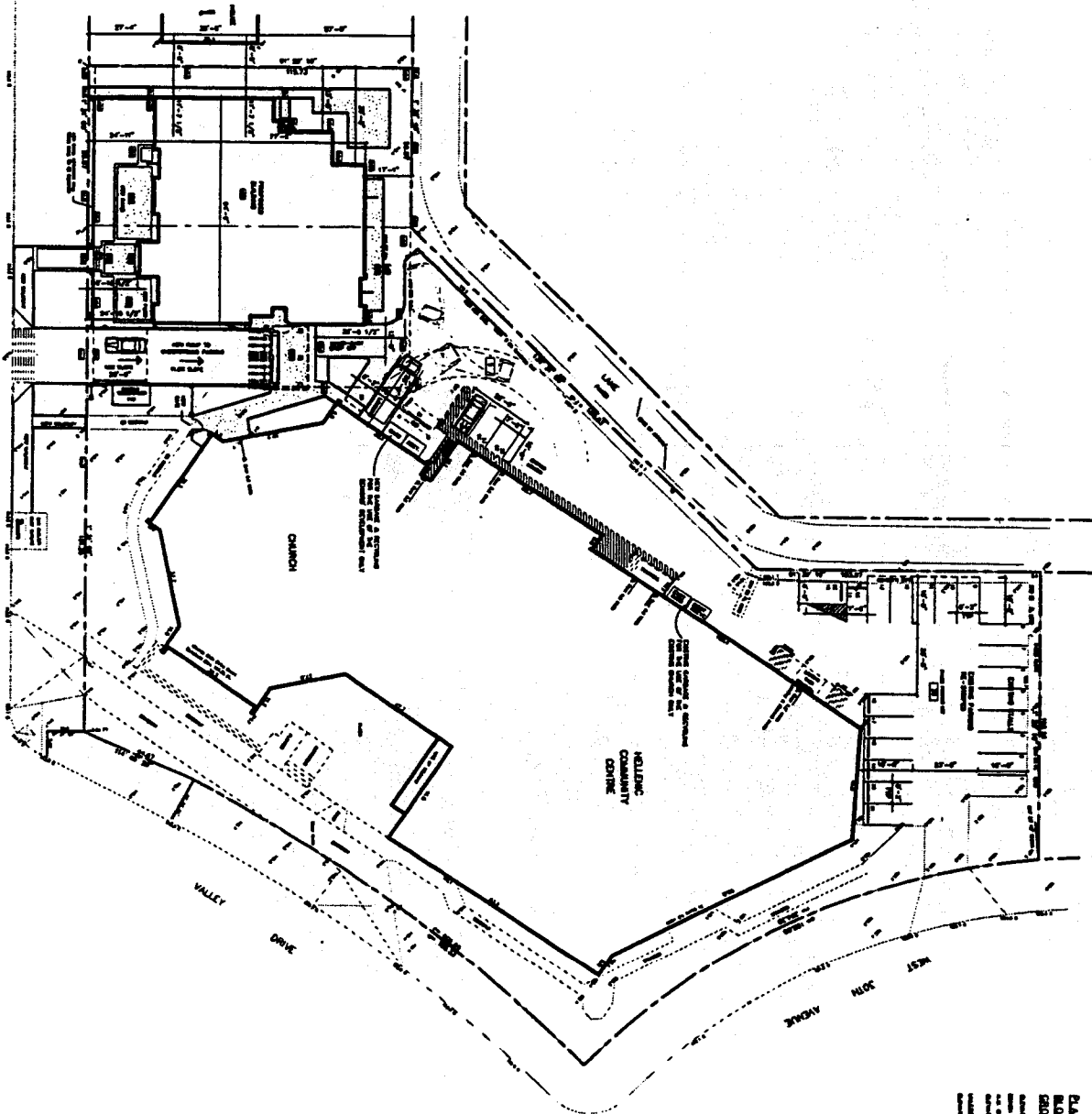

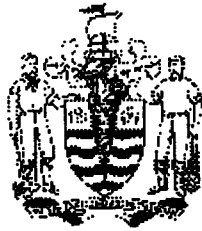

Jacqui Forbes-Roberts, General Manager of Community Services, provided a brief introduction to the report, noting the proposed text amendments would affect new construction and repairs and restoration of existing buildings. Ms. Forbes-Roberts also requested an amendment to the proposed draft by-law to amend By-law 3575 to add RS1 to Section 4.7.3, (d).

Doug Watts, Building Envelope Specialist, with the aid of a slide presentation, described the specifics of the technical and different design issues of the proposed amendments, and explained what steps other municipalities have taken to address the recommendations arising from the Barrett Commission.

Summary of Correspondence

Council was advised the following correspondence was received since the date the application was referred to Public Hearing:

one letter in support of 'Option A'.

Speakers

Mayor Owen called for speakers for and against the application.

The following spoke in support of 'Option A':

The foregoing speakers supported 'Option A' based on one or more of the following points:

application of the current FSR calculations has prevented a wide-spread use of precast concrete exterior walls; there have been very few problems with the use of pre-cast concrete, which has proven to be a versatile and durable material;

thicker exterior walls are better walls, because they can include an airspace cavity behind the cladding which provides a "rainscreen" system, more efficient insulation, thicker, more durable cladding materials; current FSR calculations discourage the foregoing;

the proposed changes in FSR definitions will immediately encourage better wall design;

brick and stone-faced walls should be encouraged.

The following generally supported 'Option A' but felt the proposed text amendments should be referred back to staff for further study and discussion with the industry:

Stuart Howard, Vancouver Planning Coalition

The following is a summary of the foregoing speakers' comments:

Option 'A' is supported in principle; however the text amendments also should address overhangs, balconies, elevated walkways, yard setbacks, and site coverage; staff should accept the electronic calculation of areas and the calculations of the Architect, given under seal; letters of assurance from a building envelope specialist are redundant at an early stage; the proposed text amendments should cover everything instead of the City issuing administrative bulletins to address further changes.

Staff Closing Comments

Ralph Segal, Planner; Eric Fiss, Planner; and Doug Watts responded to the issues raised by the speakers: the proposed text amendments are the result of a fair bit of consultation with the industry; a building envelope specialist is required to be involved in the process earlier as technical details are to be submitted at the development permit stage; staff are taking a further look at other issues, such as recesses, balconies and walkways.

Ms. Forbes-Roberts advised Council may proceed with the proposed amendments to the floor space exclusions and request staff to come back with additional amendments. Staff and the industry would prefer the FSR exclusions not be delayed.

18. In By-law No. 8097, Council, from sections 2(a) and 3.1, strikes out "Special Needs Residential Facility - Congregate Housing", and substitutes "Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing".

19. In By-law No. 8369, Council, from section 2(b), strikes out "Special Needs Residential Facility - Congregate Housing", and substitutes "Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing".

20. In By-law No. 8457, Council, in section 2:

(a) re-letters clauses (a), (b), and (c) as (b), (c), and (d); and

(b) before clause (b), inserts "(a) Seniors Supportive or Assisted Housing;"




